« *'Here I am!' he answered.* » Genesis 22:11


It is easy to say, "Here I am, Lord," when we are kneeling in church. But how easy is it to say: "Here I am, Lord," when a neighbour needs our help, when we are invited to join a parish ministry, or when we are asked to provide financial support? Often times we are called when it's not convenient for us. Discipleship is not always easy, most of the time it will make us uncomfortable and vulnerable.

The Mystery of God's Son

I have often heard brand-new parents express their feelings as they cradled their newborn child in their arms. It even seemed to rival how they feel for each other. When they tenderly looked at the child born of their love, they were overcome with generosity, gratitude and unconditional devotion. It often happens these new parents then realize how their own parents felt at their birth.



In reading the liturgical texts for this 2nd Sunday of Lent, we cannot help but be taken aback by what God asked of Abraham. After giving him a son and promising his descendants would be as numerous as the stars in the sky, God then asked Abraham to sacrifice Isaac. What a challenge to Abraham's faith! In the Gospel passage, the scene of the Transfiguration refers to Jesus' death and the announcement of his resurrection. The passage mentions the apostles' lack of comprehension that was only resolved later when they remembered Christ's words. Several years after his conversion, St. Paul proclaimed that Christ, through his Death and Resurrection, was God's complete gift to us. Through Christ, God shared his divine Life, and that nothing on earth would ever separate us from God's love.

Beginning with Isaac, Abraham's promised son, to Christ, the Son of Man and God's Son, we begin to comprehend the mystery of God's relationship with us. This gift of God's Self was possible through his Son, just like a newborn child is the product of parents' love. The Son accepted his mission from his Father and the gift of his Life.

However, *life happens*, and sorrowful events test our faith. We may even feel that God is not listening to us, which we may interpret as absence, perhaps even abandonment, as when Jesus cried out on the cross, or when Abraham, our father in faith, was tested.

The texts that we read this Sunday present the mystery of God's Son in a disconcerting manner. St. John's approach is more comforting: *For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life* (Jn 3:16).
