Stewardship Reflexion: May 5, 2019 - 3rd Sunday of Easter



“Peter was distressed that Jesus had said to him a third time, ‘Do you love me?’ and he said to him, ‘Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.’ Jesus said to him, ‘Feed my sheep.’” (John 21:17)

All of us are challenged to show our love for Jesus and others. Discern how God is calling you to use your time in prayer, your talent in charitable works and your treasure to assist those who in need. Remember that giving is an act of worship and helps advance the mission of our parish and greater Church.

Third Sunday of Easter (C)

May 5th, 2019

On the shore

After an unsuccessful night of fishing, Simon-Peter and six other disciples prepared to return to shore. Then on the shore, a stranger who seemed to know them, asked for some fish. These experienced fishermen had nothing to lose by casting their net on the right side of the boat. To their astonishment, they ended up with such an abundant catch that they could barely haul in the net.



The disciples then recognized Christ, the Risen Lord and one by one, they came to meet him. All had witnessed the miraculous catch and struggled with the weight of the fish in their net. The Lord's presence and actions reminded them of the mission that had been entrusted to them. Was it not Christ who walked along the shore of the Sea of Galilee and called them by name? *Follow me, and I will make you fish for people* (Mt 4:19). They had accepted Jesus' invitation and left their nets and boats behind.

That morning, they brought Christ some freshly caught fish. Jesus invited them to eat with him because their night shift was long and they were hungry. They also ate bread with the fish. This meal with the Risen Christ quelled their appetites and reminded them their mission would be to feed the hungry masses and satisfy their spiritual needs. The community dimension of their mission would be based on expressing their faith and sharing it. Just as their net was overflowing, their challenges would be great.

At the end of their meal, Jesus asked Simon Peter: *Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?* As this dialogue with Jesus continued, the disciple responded with his love and willingness to follow Christ who entrusted him with his apostolic mission: *Follow me*. The net would be wide and full. The work of evangelization is on-going.

The Risen Lord appeared for the third time at Lake Tiberias. Since Christ remained on the shore, he indicated that this unique ecclesial experience would unfold through the work of his disciples. Just as Christ did not throw the net on the right side of the boat, the disciples would assume this work of evangelization. As they professed their faith in the Risen Christ, they acknowledged their mission would entail bringing in a full net.
