"This is my commandment: love one another as I love you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends" John 15:12-13

As Jesus said, « *Let the children come to me... »*

Remember that the way we welcome children in church directly affects

the way they respond to the church,

True Friends

True friends are rare. We have lots of on-line "friends", colleagues at work, neighbours, and acquaintances. Yet true friends, faithful, discrete, attentive, respectful, and supportive are rare. Today people have hundreds of friends on Twitter, Facebook and other Internet resources. But it only takes something very minor and these pseudo-friends can "unfriend" and cut us off if they are angry or vindictive. So many young people are devastated when this happens.



When Jesus spoke about friendship, it referred to something else. Until that time, he was the teacher, and leader, and the apostles were his disciples. When he knew the end was approaching, he changed the tone of his teachings: *I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends.* (Jn 15:15).

The friendship that Christ describes is complete with confidence, reciprocity and love. Jesus did not hesitate to speak of love in the most perfect and inclusive definition of the term. The love that Jesus wishes to share originates from God the Father's heart. The Father's gives his love to the Son who shares his love, enabling us to enter into the same mystery of God, since God is love. This circle of love originates from the Father to the Son, from Christ to us and from us to others and ultimately returns to God. *Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God* (1 Jn 4:7)

It would be impossible to improve on this. We venerate and both fear and obey God. Jesus teaches us another approach: one of proximity, intimacy, friendship and love. It is through loving one another that we discover the mystery of God.
