Therefore, we will continue to have one livestreamed mass every weekend alternating between St. Denis & St. Claude, both livestreamed on the St. Claude Facebook page. Father will be celebrating all weekday masses in private for the intentions noted on the bulletins and there will be no eucharistic adoration for the next two weeks. Everyone is encouraged to do their part in social distancing, sanitizing, and washing hands to help stop this virus from spreading. And get vaccinated as soon as you are eligible. We can do these sacrifices for the good of all.*

Let us recite the chaplet of Holy Rosary daily. Through the intercession of Our Lady Mary, let us pray for an end to the pandemic, for our parish, for our families, and for the conversion of all Christians. ***Fr. Peter's second anniversary of priestly ordination: (June 1, 2019 – June 1, 2021):** The priesthood is not a job. It is a calling from Jesus, to bring Jesus to His people, and to bring the people to Jesus. When we get to heaven, we will understand more fully what a great gift our priests are. We will understand that it was our priests who gave us new life with the Holy Trinity through Baptism. It was our priests who fed us with the word of God and the Holy Eucharist each Sunday to give us the strength to live as followers of Jesus. It was our priests who forgave us our sins; it was our priests who made it possible for our parents to come together in the sacrament of Holy Matrimony to raise us as followers of Jesus. Many of our relatives were made ready to go to heaven by our priests, who anointed them and forgave their sins in their dying moments.

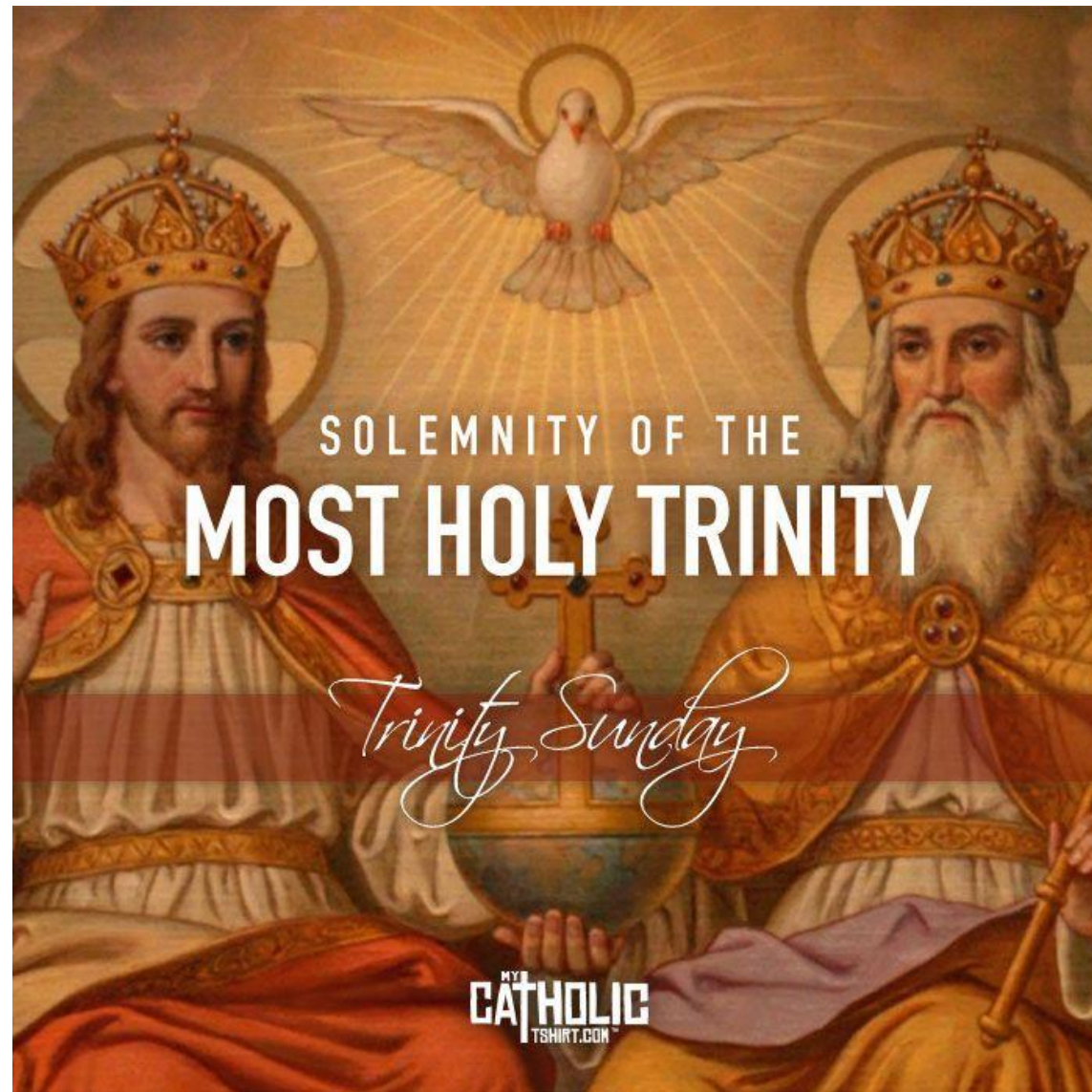
