## Peace...flowing like a river

It is striking to note that in the ten countries reporting the highest suicide rates, some, like Japan and South Korea are prosperous, while others, like Guyana and Burundi are poor. These data prove that the standard of living is not a factor. Yet there is a common denominator: the victims are people who have negative experiences, whether it is a lack of self-esteem, affection, or respect and they cannot see a way out of their circumstances.

### *Like a peaceful river*

Today's first reading was written after a period of war in which Jerusalem was razed, the Temple burned to the ground and people deported to Babylon. Yet the prophet Isaiah proclaims that God will always take care of his people and His first gift will be peace: *Rejoice with Jerusalem and be glad with her... (Is 66:10) I will extend prosperity to her like a river, and the wealth of the nations like an overflowing stream (Is 66:12).*

In the Bible, peace is much more than the absence of war. Rather, it refers to life in general, a feeling of integrity in our personal lives and in society. It is based on trusting one another. When we read the Bible, we discover throughout the history of the Jewish people, the certainty that God loved and would take care of them. The first reading illustrates this with the image of a small child safe in his mother's arms: *As a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you ... (Is 66:13) and you shall nurse and be carried on her arm, and dandled on her knees ... (Is 66:12).* The child in his mother's arms is comforted by her presence, voice, body and warmth. The child is never alone and is at peace.

### *Peace!*

When Jesus sent His disciples on their mission, He did not tell them to announce God's judgment or the end of the world. He said to them: *Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this house!'* (Lk 10:5). With this greeting, we enter another's *house*, whether the occupant is welcoming, sorrowful, cynical or despairing. Disciples must be a sign of a new beginning, a seed of hope. The first message the occupant hears and understands is that he/she is not alone in his/her distress. Whatever the mission that the Lord entrusts to us, our first act must be to enter another's *space*, to discover where and in what circumstances he/she lives and what his/her concerns are. Then, through our involvement, we endeavor to help fill the emptiness he/she feels and doing this, we bring peace.

At each Eucharistic celebration, just before Communion, the priest recites the prayer: *Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles: Peace I leave you, my peace I give you...* Like a river, Christ's peace flows constantly and as disciples, we both bring and receive it. Through us, Christ's peace enters our hearts.
