Annual Diocesan Pilgrimage in St. Malo – Sunday, August 19, 2018

The annual diocesan pilgrimage at the grotto of 'Notre Dame de Lourdes' will be held in St. Malo on Sunday, August 19, 2018. Mass will be celebrated, at the grotto site, in **English at 9 AM** (with institution to the ministry of lector of Paul Nguyen diocesan seminarian) and in **French at 11 AM** (with admission to candidacy for ordination as deacon and priest, of Serge Buissé, diocesan seminarian). Both masses will be presided by Archbishop Albert LeGatt. This year there will be Veneration of the Missionary Cross (sign of evangelization in The Americas): 9 AM - 3 PM. 

Baptized and Embracing our Missionary Vocation



Several passages from the Bible refer to people being sent out on missions. The first reading this Sunday relates the adventure of the prophet Amos who went into hostile territory where his presence was neither anticipated nor appreciated. In the Gospel, we read that Jesus sent out his disciples, two by two. They were not to bring anything superfluous with them, but to rely on the generosity of those they encountered. Their mission was to preach repentance.

As this was the first time Jesus sent his disciples on a mission, he wanted them to succeed and not return disappointed and defeated. His instructions were precise and Christ bestowed special powers on them.

To lend authority to their preaching, Jesus enabled them to cast out evil spirits and heal the sick: two signs that indicated the Messianic era had arrived. Jesus emphasized that their behavior mattered more than their power. He insisted they bring no food, no bags, no money, no shoes except sandals and only one tunic.

With these specific and strict instructions, their attention was focused on their mission to spread the Word. It was their one and only concern. Jesus continued his instructions on how to act, depending whether they received a welcoming or resentful reception from the villagers. If the disciples were well received, they could remain there for as long as necessary. If they faced a hostile crowd, as they left they would shake off the dust of the place. Jesus cautioned his disciples their missions could either succeed or fail.

God inspires women and men who embrace their missionary vocation. Jesus, through these modern missionaries, continues to reach out to people everywhere. Christ acknowledges our weaknesses and failings. However, we know through our Baptism and Confirmation, the Holy Spirit gives us the strength and courage to be prophets for these modern times.
