***UPDATE* Summer Chapels during the COVID-19 Pandemic**

For a long time, the faithful who enjoy getting away have been able to celebrate the Sunday Mass by visiting rural parishes or summer chapels. Unfortunately, the pandemic has complicated things. Some chapels or parishes are open but must limit the number of attendees. Other chapels will open only if COVID restrictions are further relaxed. For now, four of our summer chapels are celebrating Sunday mass:

- Falcon Lake: Mass will be at 10:30 a.m. Communion will also be distributed outside after mass.
- Traverse Bay: Mass will be celebrated at 7:30 p.m. on Saturday and at 10:30 a.m. on Sunday.

- Albert Beach: Mass will be celebrated in French at 10:30 a.m. Please call 204-292-2278 to register.

- Grand Marais: Mass is celebrated every second Saturday at 5 p.m. On Sunday morning, there is either a mass or a communion service at 10 a.m.


WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS & THE ELDERLY - July 25, 2021
