Stewardship Reflection

October 21, 2018 - 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"For the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many." Mark 10:45

If you held a mirror up to your life, would it reflect God's love and mercy? If you are struggling with this, try changing your attitude from "I want more" to "thank you God for everything you have given me, I have enough to share". This change in perspective will bring you joy through service to others.



Making Service our Priority

Since the world began, the quest for power has always been a major motivator for women and men. Who, in the depths of his or her heart, has not tried for a more prestigious position within the family, in the business world, in politics and even within the Christian community? Career paths are carefully plotted and individualism reigns supreme.

In the Gospel, we meet two interesting people: James and John. Zebedee's sons make an astonishing request to Jesus, who had chosen them to be his disciples. They asked him:

"Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory."

Then Jesus explained his views on how true power should function. Unlike powerful people who exert great influence and claim privileges for themselves and colleagues, Jesus taught that selfless service would be the measure of success and greatness. He himself would provide the best example by giving up his life to save humanity. Jesus, our Saviour, humbled himself even going as far as to become a slave.

According to the Gospels, it is through serving others that one becomes powerful in God's eyes. Jesus taught that those who fight to ensure respect for others and for laws that are fair and just, are powerful. People who bring hope, support and sustain others are truly powerful in God's world.

To accomplish this, we must accept that suffering and rejection will undoubtedly hamper our way forward. We may also experience oppressive and invasive feelings of weakness and uselessness. This is what the Lord and his ambassadors, the prophet Isaiah and St. Paul, indicted would happen as people carried out their missions.

What great and incredible things could happen if the words power and service were synonymous!
