Stewardship Reflection: November 10, 2019 - 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time



"May our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father, who has loved us and given us everlasting encouragement and good hope through his grace, encourage your hearts and strengthen them in every good deed and word."


(2 Thessalonians 2:16-17)

There are two important lessons here. First, we are called to be generous with our encouragement and hope. As God shows us mercy, we must be merciful to others. Second, joy is contagious! The joy we receive from doing good works not only strengthens us, it encourages others as well. Share the joy of living your faith whenever you can.

32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time (C) - November 10th, 2019

What does resurrection really mean?

Is there life after death? What happens to us when we die, when the human body becomes a corpse and is either buried or cremated? Is it only the memory of the person that remains? Does the spirit of the deceased exist elsewhere?



In Jesus' day, people had specific ideas of life after death. They even believed that this new life encompassed the whole person, an idea expressed by their interpretation of the resurrection of the body. Yet a group of more skeptical people treated these ideas with ridicule and confronted Jesus with a possible scenario in which a woman married the oldest of seven brothers. When he died, according to custom, she was married in turn to the other six, who also died. She was widowed seven times. Christ was asked who would be her husband in the afterlife.

Jesus responds to his adversaries by reproaching them for thinking eternal life would be a duplicate of the present. Those who enter into eternal life do not experience earthly constraints. Food and relationships are not part of this new scenario. We trust God and anticipate eternal life. Our concept of resurrection is different.

We don't think of eternal life as a reanimation and our minds are not constrained by concepts of time and space. Eternal life with God is beyond all this. The term resurrection of the dead means that people will be *alive* in God and *exceed* bodily limitations. We can only imagine what eternity with God means and neither you nor I have the details.
