The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB), through the Commission for Justice and Peace, released a statement entitled **Poverty in Canada: Ensuring Safe, Secure and Affordable Housing** in anticipation of the Third World Day of the Poor to be held on 17 November, 2019. Poverty is a serious issue not only in developing countries, but also in Canada. The statement presents a brief overview of poverty in Canada today, with a focus on the current housing crisis, and provides a short list of some key Catholic organizations engaged in the alleviation of poverty in our country. The Catholic Bishops of Canada call for collaboration between charitable organizations, all levels of government, and dioceses/eparchies, as well as local parishes, to support individuals who are in need.

People are thinking about the end of our world. Many conversations discuss the consequences of global warming and the possible demise of our planet.


At the cosmic and ecological level, one wonders about the effect of the *hole in the ozone layer*. Recently we learned about earthquakes that were rated high on the *Richter scale*. In the Bible, we read frightening texts like: *Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be great earth-quakes, and in various places famines and plagues; and there will be dreadful portents and great signs from heaven* (Lk 21:10-11).

Where is the Lord in all this? Is Christ leaving us alone and forgetting the Covenant with his people? Certainly life’s difficulties are calls for conversion but the Lord is always with us. In the face of adversity and persecution, Christ promises to inspire us: *for I will give you words and (a)wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to withstand or contradict* (Lk 21:15). God watches over us: *... not a hair of your head will perish* (Lk 21:18).

What should we do in the meantime? Though God’s words and love inspire, some of us may wait fearfully for months and years for the Lord’s return. The Gospel offers us joyous hope during our time on earth. Our days can be spent witnessing and committing to the service of others. We are confident that God always loves us.

Our commitments to help the most abandoned people, to respect and protect the Earth entrusted to us, to build a world of peace, justice and freedom. These are projects that involve us today and in the future. This is our game plan. We can’t remain inactive and grumble about our fate.

Despite the evils that plague and threaten us, the Lord invites us to persevere. With this attitude, our commitments will take root and prepare the way for a better future.
