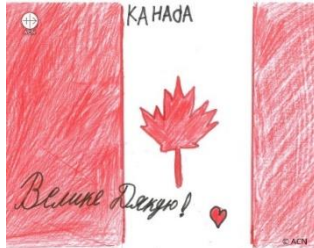

In a recent pastoral letter, the Ukrainian Catholic bishops of Canada invite people to pray, fast, and act in support of their brothers and sisters in Ukraine. In the appeal, they invite parishioners to donate to several charitable organizations, including Aid to the Church in Need - Canada.

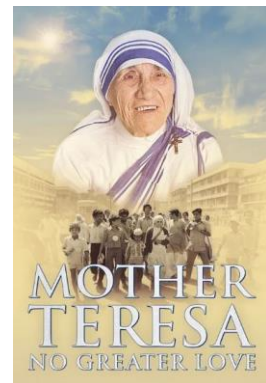


In the three-page letter, they express the view that, like the crises the Ukrainian people have experienced in their history, including the Holodomor - also referred to as the Great Famine (1932-1933) - the intent of the current war is "to erase the identity and history of the Ukrainian people - a genocide in the making."

*** Mother Teresa: No Greater Love – November 2 and 3, 2022**



Mother Teresa: No Greater Love, the newest documentary film from the Knights of Columbus, will be premiered in Manitoba theatres this Nov. 2 and 3 (Winnipeg, Brandon, Winkler). In Winnipeg, the film will be presented at 7 pm at the Landmark Cinemas 8 Grant Park, 1120 Grant Ave. In Winkler, the film will run at 7 pm at the Landmark Cinemas 5 Winkler, 777 Norquay Drive. In Brandon, the film will be shown at the Landmark Cinemas 9 Brandon, 1570 18th Street.

The film premiered in the U.S. earlier this month and was a smashing box-office success. In fact, it earned more than \$1.2 million in ticket sales and Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly announced (read it [here](#)) that the Knights would allocate all of the revenue it receives from ticket sales to charitable purposes and efforts that advance the legacy of Mother Teresa.

The documentary was released to commemorate the 25th anniversary of Mother Teresa's passing.
