On Friday, March 25, 2022, Pope Francis will consecrate Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary during the Celebration of Penance that he will preside at 11:00 a.m. (Central Daylight Time) in St. Peter's Basilica in Rome.

In our archdiocese, a Mass in French presided by Bishop Noël Delaquis, will be celebrated at 11:00 a.m. at the Cathedral of Saint Boniface. A Mass in English presided by Fr. Anixavier

Anthony-muthu, OFM Cap. will be celebrated at 11:00 a.m. at Holy Cross Parish. Please note that in addition to the Mass, Holy Cross Church will be open for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from 9:00 am to 6:30 pm. If you cannot make it to Mass, this is an opportunity to worship to pray for peace in Ukraine and to pray for Ukraine and Russia.

**Development and Peace: Standing up to corporate power in Honduras**



The *People and Planet First* campaign is about helping communities stand up to corporate power.

In Honduras, as in much of the Global South, corporations often threaten and criminalize activists who speak up against their abuses.

The Lenca Indigenous leader Víctor Vásquez was imprisoned for fighting the corporate takeover of his people's ancestral territory. Development and Peace's partner, the Honduran Centre for the Promotion of Community Development (CEHPRODEC), helped free him from jail.

Another partner, Caritas Choluteca, trains and accompanies community leaders in advocating for policies that respect human rights and the environment.

Recently, they got mayoral election candidates to undertake to declare the municipality of Orocuina a mining-free zone if elected.
