**+ In St. Claude:** at 11:00 Am: Mass in French in the church.

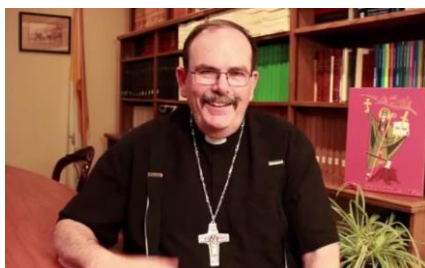

# Lives and Circumstances



Have you ever had the opportunity while flying to visit the cockpit? What an experience! The pilots are constantly attentive.

Pilots contend with turbulence and control the plane so that the passengers and crew arrive safely at their destination. As Pierre Péladeau, businessman, once commented: "It's like God, I don't see the pilot, but I have faith that he or she will take me to my destination."

We live on our beautiful blue planet. What will be our final destination? At this point, there are lots of surprises and mysteries. Our birth is the starting point of our pilgrimage on earth. We too will be called upon to verify our positions as we

approach our God. We acknowledge there will be difficult times ahead, whether we like it or not. We will have some new and different opportunities in life. Hopefully we won't be lured astray by temptations which may appear to be attractive alternatives, but prove to be deceptive. Let's verify with our Pilot and see if we're still on the right track.

St. Paul gives us points of reference to situate us during our lives: comfort, love, communion, tenderness and compassion. These compile into a beautiful image of an authentic Christian. In his letter, St. Paul encourages the Philippians to proceed: *... to live your life in a manner worthy of the Gospel of Christ... I will remain and continue with all of you for your progress and joy in faith... If then there is any encouragement in Christ, any consolation from love, any sharing in the Spirit, any compassion and sympathy, make my joy complete.* The same words come back like a refrain: *Be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind.*

There is an additional comment: *... Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves.* I have always enjoyed this message: *Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others.* The other person has something to provide that we can admire.

Christ is our landmark and destination. The first reading from Isaiah invites us to take a look at our behaviour. The psalm is a request to the Lord to teach us his ways: *The Lord is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.*

In my opinion, the most devious enemy is not outside, but inside the Church. It happens that some Catholics who attend Mass every Sunday but who, when the Lord asks them to change their lives, do not even lift a finger. Let's move our ten fingers to rediscover what it is to offer a warm hand and a wide open heart as Jesus does. We can do it!
