These measures include the reduction, in 2021, of the Diocesan Tax from 20% to 15% and of the parishes' contribution to the Clergy Pension Fund from 4% to 3%, the receipt of online donations designated to the parishes, regular communication to ensure the safety of the faithful, collaboration between the diocesan Pastoral Services team and the parish coordinators, the presentation of spiritual resources online and the live streaming of the Mass, and letters and messaging that could be adapted by the parishes to meet their needs.

In Honduras and Cambodia, organizations supported by Development and Peace are raising the voices of communities oppressed by a model of economic development that violates their rights. The Honduran Center for the Promotion of Community Development (CEHPRODEC) trains environmental leaders to defend natural resources, the environment and human rights. In Cambodia, Development and Partnership in Action (DPA)'s mission is, in part, to enable communities affected by extractive industries to gain advocacy skills so they can organize and defend their rights. This year, the action highlighted by the **People and Planet First** campaign is about holding Canadian companies accountable for their operations abroad - to ensure that Canada is not complicit in the violation of the rights of our brothers and sisters. ***"Go your way; your faith has made you well."
(Mk 10, 52)***

We celebrate World Mission Sunday 2021 with the following theme: "It is impossible for us not to speak about what we have seen and heard." (Acts 4:20) This Sunday's Good News talks about God's compassion, His fatherly love which, on one hand, in the Old Covenant, saves His people and guides them to salvation; on the other hand, in the New Covenant, God saves the world through the only

Mediator, Jesus Christ.

Today's present condition makes us aware of the human poverty that cries out to the Lord in search of help and mercy. In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus heals the blind man in Jericho. The paradox comes from the fact that this blind man sees exactly who Jesus of Nazareth is. He calls Him "Son of David." In the biblical tradition, it is the name of the Messiah awaited by the chosen people. We must allow ourselves to be led by the Master towards the enlightening of Faith. Today, Jesus invites us to open the eyes of our hearts in order to welcome in faith the vision of a suffering and triumphant Messiah.

In his message to the Pontifical Mission Societies on May 21, 2020, Pope Francis wrote: "Nor can missionary fervour ever be obtained as the result of reasoning or calculation. To be 'in a state of mission' is a reflection of gratitude. It is the response of one who by gratitude is made docile to the Spirit and is therefore free. Only in the freedom of gratitude can one truly know the Lord, whereas it is useless and above all improper to insist on presenting missionary activity and the proclamation of the Gospel as if they were a binding duty, a kind of 'contractual obligation' on the part of the baptized."

Today, we are invited to listen carefully and meditate on Pope Francis' Message for World Mission Sunday 2021. With kindness we welcome these words from the Acts of the Apostles: "It is impossible for us not to speak about what we have seen and heard." (Acts 4:20)

May Our Lady of the Missions and Saint Joseph intercede for us.
