* New Clarifications regarding COVID-19 Prevention Measures:

New provincial restrictions came into effect on October 26.

Funerals, prayer vigils for the deceased, weddings and baptisms are limited to 150 people or 50 % of capacity, whichever is lower. No proof of vaccination is required.

Furthermore, the Archdiocese is issuing new instructions on parish meetings, conferences, assemblies, etc. As of today, these meetings may be held with more than 25 people present if proof of vaccination is asked of in-person participants.

31st Sunday in Ordinary Time B - October 31st, 2021



"You shall love the Lord your God, you shall love your neighbour as yourself." (Mark 12:30–31).

On this Sunday that concludes the Missionary Month, the biblical text brings us back to the essence of the Christian faith: love. The first reading mentions the *Shema Israel*, Israel's daily prayer, taken from the book

of Deuteronomy: "Hear, O Israel! The Lord is our God, the Lord alone! Therefore, you shall love the Lord, your God, with your whole heart, and with your whole being, and with your whole strength." (Dt 6, 4–5) This prayer is the equivalent of the "Our Father." As Christians, we repeat it with love, knowing full well that the Lord our God is truly unique, but not lonely, and we worship his Unity in the Trinity of Persons.

In the Gospel, Jesus brings together the love of God and the love of the neighbour. He shows us the path to follow in order to attain holiness. This is not the fulfillment of norms only, but the realization of true love, for God is Love. Jesus achieves a stroke of genius: He joins the love of the neighbour to the love of God, thus creating one single precept. This connection fits well with the prophet's thoughts wherein God declares: "For it is loyalty that I desire, not sacrifice." (Hos 6:6) Mark made the meeting between Jesus and a scribe a happy episode. After Jesus' answer, no one dared to question Him anymore.

Let us recall the theme that has accompanied us throughout this Missionary month which is coming to an end: "It is impossible for us not to speak about what we have seen and heard." (Acts 4:20) At the end of this Missionary month, it is time to go on mission. Pay attention! The world is still under the influence of the coronavirus pandemic. It is not easy to get around. But there are many ways to be missionaries and to support the Mission. Thus, let us do something for the Mission: a prayer, a donation, and many other good deeds. Let us put love at the heart of the Mission. For the love of God and the neighbour is the very essence of missionary action, it is the foundation of all missionary initiative.

May Our Lady of the Missions and Saint Joseph intercede for us.
