I am in a dilemma: I am physically in Vietnam, but my heart and thoughts are at the parish! Thinking about leaving my family, saying goodbye to my parents makes me sad... please continue to pray for me and for my family.

My greetings, my prayers and thanks to all the parishioners of good will of Saint-Claude and Saint-Denis. May God bless you all. Fr. Peter"

2018-19 Diocesan Financial Report

The 2018-2019 financial year was marked with projects, efforts and challenges that demonstrate, in the words of bishop LeGatt, that "we have indeed been attentive to the guidance of the Holy Spirit". In 2018, our diocesan family celebrated the 200th anniversary of the Roman Catholic Church in Western and Northern Canada. In 2019, the Marriage, Family and Respect for Life Service organized various events to help us reflect on how to faithfully live out our Catholic faith. Such as a workshop on Health Care Directives and the question of Medical Assistance in Dying. The Service also organized, in collaboration with the Archdiocese of Winnipeg and the Ukrainian Catholic Archeparchy of Winnipeg, a family conference on the themes of listening to the Gospel and renewing the family bond. The faithful generously contributed to the recruiting and Formation of Priests through the Good Shepherd Campaign. The Archdiocese also had to deal with the unexpected collapse, in October 2018, of the southeast corner of the Archbishop's residence. 
St. Claude Club Âge d'Or: Grouille ou Rouille 2019 – Friday, October 25, 2019

27th Sunday in Ordinary Time (C) - October 6th, 2019

Trusting our faith

The liturgy this Sunday offers us two readings that explore our faith from different perspectives. One is about the power of faith while the other is about prompt and humble service. The Apostles asked the Lord to increase their faith. (Lk 17:5). Jesus asked his disciples about their own faith practices: Who among you would say to your slave... come here at once and take your place at the table? (Lk 17:7). Our focus today is on exploring our faith.



Faith may often be perceived as a commodity that we can possess in greater or lesser degrees and that we can access or call upon as needed. Viewing our faith

from a perspective of quantity is not the way to proceed. To view it from a perspective of quality is far better as long as it does not lead us into making value judgments such as ... *This person's faith is/is not stronger than mine!* Jesus focused our attention on the power of faith as shown in the passage about the tree that is uprooted and planted in the sea.

What should we remember from this Gospel? Whether we consider our faith as small as mustard seeds or much bigger, it is always powerful. Just as a seed contains the potential of the future plant, similarly our faith grows as God's love takes root in our lives. We trust our faith because it is the gateway to welcoming God's love. As much as love can transform a life, bring about radical changes, sustain our perseverance and awaken altruistic commitments, faith can make what may seem impossible today, become possible tomorrow. We should never doubt the power of our faith.
