Openness and Generosity

"Is it white or black"? "I'm right and you're wrong"! Unlike us, God sees things differently. The thread of today's texts begins with the words of Eldad and Medad. Inspired by the Spirit, they prophesied in the camp of the Israelites. Joshua insisted that they stop but Moses saw a great opportunity for all Israelites to become prophets. The same situation is repeated in the Gospel where someone has just cast out evil spirits in Jesus' name. Christ replied that if someone acted in God's name, they also acted in His name. His disciples were concerned that their share of their *inheritance* would be too small and they wanted to reduce the circle of heirs!



We have all received the gifts of the Spirit. God spreads these gifts in abundance according to each person's vocation. Let's examine our own lives. How many times have we had this desire to hinder other people from achieving? Pride has a strong hold on us. Too often we only see another's mistakes.

We also remember that Jesus said ordinary gestures, such as giving a glass of water, would be rewarded. Acting in Jesus' name does not mean we work miracles, but we should credit the Source of our actions. You can, humbly and without pride, affirm that you act on Christ's behalf because you have invited Him to reside within you.

Pope Francis frequently says that he himself is a sinner and asks us to pray for him. He asks this at almost every appearance. Jesus opens our hearts and encourages us to reach out to our brothers and sisters in our daily lives. Learning to be free of societal constraints and expectations and following Christ's teachings will require conscious and, at times, difficult efforts.

Yet nothing will deter us if we are focused on love. Talent, money, fame, glory - these values are all good provided they do not distract us from imitating Christ. However, these secondary items must never become our reason for living, or prevent us from focusing on our heavenly home. With prayer and effort, openness and generosity will guide us.

As baptized people and therefore missionaries, we proclaim the Good News. The thread of these passages leads us on the road "*in Jesus' name*". His disciples understood Christ's teachings. Moses said: *Would that all the Lord's people were Prophets, and that the Lord would put his spirit on them* (Num 11:29). We are witnesses to the power of love that transforms our human reality.
