Love creates something new

There is nothing new under the sun (Qo1:9). This quotation, found in the Bible, is from Qoheleth, also called the Preacher, a somewhat disillusioned but wise old man. To a certain extent, we can agree. Of course, electric cars will make significant changes and help protect the environment. Yet many cars still use fossil fuels. While my cell phone provides me with instant pictures, people have always cherished and created their own images, as seen on the walls and ceilings of the Lascaux Cave in France where over 600 paintings

dating back 17,000 years have been discovered.

The real novelty

The only real novelty is not at the level of what we have, or what we do, but who we are. This is what Jesus taught his disciples. He wanted them to aspire to a new humanity, to form a community of life. To that effect, Christ gave them his Spirit, his inner energy that renews everything and allows us to love as He does: *I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another* (Jn 13:34). Jesus said the distinctive sign of his disciples would not be to dress differently from others, or adopt a different diet, but to live by these relationship guidelines: *By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another* (Jn 13:35). This ancient text dating from the end of the second century tries to explain who Christians are to a pagan named Diognetus:

Christians are not distinguished from other men by country, language, nor by the customs which they observe. And it is while following the customs of the natives in clothing, food, and the rest of ordinary life that they display to us their wonderful and admittedly striking way of life. ... As citizens they participate in everything with others. ... They marry, like everyone else, and they have children. ... They love all men. ... They are dishonored, and yet in their very dishonor they are glorified; they are spoken ill of and yet are justified; they are reviled but bless; they are insulted and repay the insult with honor. (Excerpts from the Letter to Diognetus: 5, 6)

Small steps

My friend Teresa told me that after meeting one of her nephews at her husband's funeral, she called to wish him a happy birthday. While talking to him, she said: "Listen Steve, if you are available tomorrow, I can take the subway, meet you and we can have dinner together. If we want to stay close, we need to make time to see each other". A phrase came to me: "*create connections*". Yes, we all possess the power to create what really matters. Our next steps could be "*creating connections*" where we nourish and deepen our relationships.
