#### Implementation of the new phrasing of Our Father (in French)

At the annual meeting of the French Sector in September 2018, the Catholic Bishops of Canada of the Latin Rite decided that, **as of the first Sunday of Advent (December 2, 2018)**, the new French translation of the Our Father will officially replace the old version in all its public liturgical form. More specifically, the wording "Ne nous laisse pas entrer en tentation", will replace the current text "Ne nous soumets pas à la tentation" which has been in use across Canada since 1966. Decree from the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops on the Use of the Modified Text of Our Father (in French).

We will all have that day when we are standing before God and our life is played out like a movie. When this happens and God asks each of us, "What have you done with the gifts that I have given you?" How will you respond?

# The Fig Tree

Instead of thinking about destruction and the end of the world, why not focus on aspects of completion and fulfillment as St. Mark suggests? Jesus said that we will see...*the Son of man coming in clouds with great power and glory*... (Mk 13:26). These words refer to the majestic and triumphant moments of the harvest.

The reference to the fig tree introduces the question of time: the day and the hour of the final coming. Jesus reacted to his contemporaries' anxiety as they awaited the end of time with these encouraging words: *Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. But* 

about that day or hour, no one knows... (Mk 13:31).

This reading is full of hope. Those who only internalized a fear of God have not grasped anything from this Gospel passage. The *Day of the Lord* will be Christ's hour of victory. Christ has saved us and proclaimed his eternal love. The Son of Man will return in glory; our God is loving, compassionate and caring. Since Christ came to save the world, the faithful can anticipate the scene of the last judgment with great joy, serenity and enlightenment. It is the Father's response to our prayers: *Thy kingdom come...Come, Lord Jesus...* 

Misfortunes may happen and while those who are powerful may challenge our lives, they will eventually disappear – each in their own time. Throughout our history, in families, governments and our lives, there are four seasons. Yet our faith is focused on the fifth season! As Jesus said, the story will continue...

We must keep this hope alive! Despite potential negative experiences, Christ offers us a vision full of optimism. *I am the resurrection and the life.* ... Do not be afraid, I am with you every day until the end of time.

While some people tend to be fearful all their lives, Christians have a different perspective. Today's text is an invitation to hope, not to fear. It ends with the beautiful Parable of the Fig Tree: *As soon as its branch becomes tender and puts forth its leaves, you know that summer is near* (Mk 13:28).

We can't understand Jesus' thoughts if we are "prophets of doom". So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that he (the Lord) is near, at the very gates (Mk 13:29). Christianity embraces hope. This is the Gospel message today.
