Reality Check!

It is necessary to pay attention to titles because the same title can camouflage very different agendas! In an election, two or three people may aspire to be "Prime Minister of Canada". While one may have a business-friendly agenda, another may be more focused on social projects. In the United States, forty-four people had the same title of "President of the United States", but had very different agendas! For example, Barack Obama supported the fight against pollution while Donald Trump doubts that current practices play any part in climate change.

It was the same situation during Jesus' era. One of the most hopeful titles was *Messiah*. This word comes from the Hebrew: mašîa, which is translated as "he who has received the royal anointing" or priestly. The Greek form of the word is *Christos*,



which in English is *Christ*. We acknowledge that *Christ* is synonymous with *King*. Beginning in the first century BC, this title came with immense hope as people believed the *Messiah-King* would be sent by God to restore King David's ancient kingdom. For the majority of Jews, this King's *agenda* included raising an army to drive out the Roman invaders and cleansing the Temple.

Strange Messiah, Strange Kingdom

It was this *agenda* that the Apostle Peter foresaw for Jesus. The Apostle was correct in recognizing Jesus as the promised Messiah. Yet, he was seriously mistaken about his *agenda*. Jesus did not come to restore the King David's political kingdom, but God's! As He faced opposition and the hostility of the religious and political leaders, Jesus already foresaw his tragic end. He would be rejected and condemned to death. Peter tried to correct Jesus, to tell him that he did not understand the complexity of the title that he, Peter, had just bestowed on him. However, Jesus, in turn, chastised Peter who had not understood anything. It was not up to Jesus to adopt Peter's ideas. Instead it was up to Peter to realize Jesus' *agenda*. This *agenda* would mean that the *Messiah* would be a humble servant, who would not be royally anointed, but instead be spat upon by outraged enemies, as foreseen by the prophet Isaiah (53:1-3).

Finally, it was only after Easter that the disciples would truly understand Jesus' destiny and that they would accept his astonishing *agenda*: to reveal the presence of God the Father who loves his people, forgives and welcomes them, wants their happiness and wishes to gather them as a family whose priorities would be sharing and mutual love.

If you think about it, Jesus' *agenda* is still challenging today. Only hearts filled with his own Spirit will dare to follow Christ to the end.
