Always faithful

A warning could be displayed on our virtual screen: *"This story contains scenes that are disturbing."* It's about what we see and pay attention to, about suffering, forgiveness, mercy and kindness.

The word "Passion" is difficult and alarming because it is often synonymous with great physical and mental pain. What affects us most as we listen to Saint Luke's Passion is the way he recounts Jesus' agony. In Greek, the word "agony" also refers to "combat" in which Jesus' entire being, both Body and Spirit, are engaged.



When it comes to Christ's Passion, we are deeply marked by the flogging, the crown of thorns, the servant's ear that was cut off and the crucifixion.

In our own era, other but just as disturbing images and misfortunes assault us: bombs, senseless destruction, violence, kidnapping, murder, and the innocent victims of these atrocities. These are horrible. As we begin Holy Week, we walk in Jesus' footsteps.

We participate in Christ's sufferings - we only have to look at his disfigured face. We retrace his journey and realize that His love still shines through: with his entry into Jerusalem, his last meal, the washing of his disciples' feet, the forgiveness granted to Peter and the good thief, and his union with His heavenly Father. Christ's life is one of love and service.

We reread events that are difficult to accept and experience. Despair could take over our lives as it did for Jesus' disciples who lost their bearings and their hopes were destroyed. Their lives appeared to have come to a dead end. Strange as it may seem, God's love, through Christ, is always present, even at his rendezvous with death. God's love sustains our lives.

Christ's love and light will shine through on Easter morning. Our fidelity to Christ is not a one-day phenomenon, but an everyday occurrence.
