* Bishop LeGatt Video Message – Official Apology to Canada's Indigenous Peoples

Following last week's plenary assembly of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCCB), where an official apology was unanimously pronounced from every Catholic bishop in Canada to Indigenous peoples for the Catholic Church's part in the trauma of colonization, especially Indian Residential Schools, Archbishop Albert reflects on what this apology means. First and foremost, it is the working of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit has

been working in the hearts of all Catholics for many years, leading up to this total and unequivocal apology. If we truly believe we are One in Christ and all share in His love, we also believe that we are one in sin, and that we all carry the sin and scandal of Residential Schools. Thus, we also all share in the responsibility to inform ourselves, and partake in the many works for reconciliation that lay ahead. We truly all have a part to play. The \$30M fundraising efforts which will be undertaken by all Canadian dioceses in the coming years are part of this, but only part of the broader, individual, personal work of reconciliation that lays ahead of us. We all share in the responsibility, and we all share, through the Holy Spirit, in the way forward.

Jesus uses tough language that we may not want to hear. But, we are all called to be generous with all of our gifts. Not just the ones we pick and choose, but all our gifts, and especially the one that means the most to us! That includes our time in prayer to God, our talent in participating in parish ministries and our treasure supporting our local parish and other charities.



"What must I do to inherit eternal life?"

(Mark 10:17)

The story of the rich young man in this Sunday's Gospel describes how to become a disciple of Jesus. The question is significant: "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" (Mk 10:17) The Master recognizes that in the young man's eyes, practising the divine

commandments is the normal and ordinary way to achieve it. But the Good News suggested by Jesus is a call to go beyond this. It is not enough to be faithful to the commandments of God; it is necessary to follow the very person of the Messiah. The point of the story is not to give up possessions, but to become attached to the person of Jesus Christ. The story of the rich young man is told within Jesus' path towards His Passion. Therefore, following Christ and becoming a Christian, involves a certain austerity.

"It is impossible for us not to speak about what we have seen and heard." (Acts 4:20) We cannot forget about Saint Daniel Comboni, a bishop in whom the *sapientia crucis* shone intensely through total self-giving and an extraordinary love for the African peoples. He died of cholera precisely on October 10, 1881, in Khartoum at the age of 50. His motto - *O nigrizia o morte* (negritude or death) – talks about his total devotion to his missionary vocation. The Church is indebted to him through his *Plan for the rebirth of Africa*: a profound evangelization of this continent.

Jesus Himself adopted a way of life for His mission: an itinerant ministry, detached as much as possible from the conditions of ordinary life: from having a family and goods. In the present moment, Jesus renews this kind of calling. He says to each and every one of us: "Come and follow me." We must go beyond the faith of our fathers and become disciples of the Lord. It is a surpassing understanding that makes us realize the missionary grace.

May Our Lady of the Missions and Saint Joseph intercede for us.
