Papal Blessing

The Apostolic (Papal) blessing request form is available on the diocesan website www.archsaintboniface.ca under 'Chancery'. The directives on how to proceed for the request and the fee payment are also included. The request may be placed for an anniversary of birthday, wedding, sacerdotal and diaconal ordinations or religious life. The request should be sent to the Apostolic Nuntiatura at least one (1) month before the date of the anniversary celebration.

Marriage Tip:

What makes a happy marriage? Many things of course, but one glue that helps a lot of couples is being able to laugh when things go wrong. Is there a blunder that happened in your past that you're now able to laugh about?

Do you plan to get married in 2020? Congrats! Steps to Prepare Your Christian Marriage

Contact your parish 8 to 10 months before your planned wedding date. Thus, you will be able to meet the priest or the Parish Life Director to begin concretizing your project. During this first meeting:

- 1. You will be informed about the different marriage preparation sessions. You will be asked to attend one of these sessions before your wedding. You choose the form that suits you best. However, book early as space is limited, and you are not the only ones to get married especially during the summer!
- 2. Bring your baptismal certificates. They must have been issued in the last six months. You may have to bring them from the parish where you were baptized.
- 3. Plan at least three possible dates for your wedding. It may happen that the celebrant or church is not available on the date of your first choice.
- 4. If the celebration takes place in a parish other than the one where you reside, you must ask the written authorization of the parish priest of your parish. It's just a request to the parish office.
- 5. Shortly before the wedding, you will be invited to a special meeting for the prenuptial inquiry.
- 6. Finally, you will meet the priest or deacon to prepare for the celebration of your wedding.

The Baptism of the Lord (A)-January 12, 2020

Timeline



Christ's Baptism by St. John brings an end to the Christmas liturgical season. We have gone from one celebration to another as the mystery of the Incarnation of God's Son is made known. Christ came into our world as a source of never-ending joy (*Christmas*); his presence was revealed to the nations (*Epiphany*) and finally he was acclaimed God's Servant through whom humanity would be saved (*Baptism of the Lord*).

We begin with a reflection on Jesus' Baptism and our own. It is necessary to remember that the Baptism offered by St. John was part of a process of conversion that would welcome the Messiah. We read in the Gospel that St. John was somewhat reserved when Christ appeared on the banks of the Jordan River and asked to be baptized. This request was important because Jesus wanted to reveal his solidarity with the men and women to whom he would proclaim the Good News of Salvation. Jesus asked John to proceed with his Baptism.

Once this happened, God confirmed Christ's identity: He is his Beloved Son, the human Face of God who is Love. Through Christ, God is revealed to people through his gentleness, goodness and mercy. He is the Servant as described by the prophet Isaiah. This Servant does not raise his voice nor break the bruised reed. The Servant will free people from prisons (often of their own making) and enable them to love, as expressed through their relationship with God and others.

We may think of our own Baptism in relation to Christ's death and resurrection. Our Baptism provides us with the opportunity to immerse ourselves in communion with God as people who live in faith and solidarity with Christ, the Father's Beloved Son. We ask Christ to be part of our lives and free us from the evil that imprisons us. Christ leads us closer to God.
