CATECHISM AND PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENT OF FIRST RECONCILIATION, FIRST COMMUNIION AND CONFIRMATION:

You are expecting a child or want your child to be baptized? You know a family who is expecting or who would like their child to be baptized? If so, the parish asks the families who want to have a child baptized to follow 3 baptismal preparation sessions prior to baptism. Marriages: Steps to Prepare Your Christian Marriage

Contact your parish **8 to 10 months before your planned wedding date**. Thus, you will be able to meet the priest or the Parish Life Director to begin concretizing your project. During this first meeting:

- 1. 1. You will be informed about the different marriage preparation sessions. You will be asked to attend one of these sessions before your wedding. You choose the form that suits you best. However, book early as space is limited, and you are not the only ones to get married especially during the summer!
- 2. Bring your baptismal certificates. They must have been issued in the last six months. You may have to bring them from the parish where you were baptized.
- 3. Plan at least three possible dates for your wedding. It may happen that the celebrant or church is not available on the date of your first choice.
- 4. If the celebration takes place in a parish other than the one where you reside, you must ask the written authorization of the parish priest of your parish. It's just a request to the parish office.
- 5. Shortly before the wedding, you will be invited to a special meeting for the prenuptial inquiry.
- 6. Finally, you will meet the priest or deacon to prepare for the celebration of your wedding.

If two Catholics or a Catholic and non-Catholic are married invalidly in the eyes of the Church, regarding the Canon Law, what should you do about it?

If a dead person were to return to earth and reveal what happens in the afterlife, would it be easier to convert? Why would the Lord intervene so dramatically in our lives?

This same reflection is found in the Parable of the rich man and Lazarus which we read in today's Gospel.



From the depths of his "place of torture," the rich man asked God to send poor Lazarus to warn his five

brothers to change their behavior and convert. The sight of a ghost would surely be a significant incitement to change their lifestyle.

Yet the scene just described does not lead to true conversion. The only way to convert is to listen to the Word of God.

The rich man's brothers had many opportunities to listen to "Moses and the prophets" if they wanted to live successful lives and achieve eternal happiness. This meant they had to be open to God's Word that was revealed to the people of Israel.

Jesus Christ, the Word sent by the Father to save us, is our guide. We have the sacrament of salvation and Christ is our light of nations. The Church proclaims Christ's mission of spreading the Good News to all who wish to hear it. The teachings and witnessing of our sisters and brothers in the Faith are the surest ways to grow in faith and love.

Those who neither welcome the living Word nor give God a rightful place in their lives will experience a change in the Hereafter. On the other hand, those who follow the Gospel requirements are now preparing their happiness in the next world.

To succeed in our life, we have to choose between waiting for ghosts (who may not appear) and listening to the Word of God. It's our decision to make!
