### **Prayer Intention for June 2021**

The Beauty of Marriage – Let us pray for young people who are preparing for marriage with the support of a Christian community: may they grow in love, with generosity, faithfulness, and patience. Let us pray:

#### Parish life:

\*According to the new released public health restrictions, all religious gatherings are to remain closed until June 26th. Therefore, we will continue to have one livestreamed mass every weekend alternating between St. Denis & St. Claude, both livestreamed on the St. Claude Facebook page. Father will be celebrating all weekday masses in private for the intentions noted on the bulletins and there will be no eucharistic adoration until then. Everyone is encouraged to do their part in social distancing, sanitizing, and washing hands to help stop this virus from spreading. And get vaccinated as soon as you are eligible. We can do these sacrifices for the good of all.

Let us recite the chaplet of Holy Rosary daily. Through the intercession of Our Lady Mary, let us pray for an end to the pandemic, for our parish, for our families, and for the conversion of all Christians. In urgent cases, such as Anointing of the Sick, please do not hesitate to call Fr. Peter at 204.952.4531.

## \*NEW: Communion outside after the livestreamed Mass

Distribution of communion outside is POSSIBLE at this time. FIVE people from different households can form a line to receive communion from the pastor or extraordinary minister of communion. They must respect physical distancing and wear masks until the moment of receiving the host. Once FIVE people have received communion, another group of FIVE can approach to receive the host.

People can also receive communion via a "drive-thru" approach. With this method, the faithful are asked to drive up in their vehicle to the pastor or extraordinary minister of communion. They can then lower their window and receive communion, or briefly step out of their car and receive communion. Masks must be worn at all times.

• In our parishes, after the livestreamed Mass on Sunday June 13 in St. Claude, from 12:00 to 12:30 PM, Fr. Peter will be at the west entrance (main entrance) of St. Claude church to distribute Holy Communion to parishioners of St. Denis and St. Claude via "drive-by" method. You enter from the north -> stopping at the west entrance -> staying in your car -> receiving Holy Communion -> taking a short moment to consume the Body of Christ and silently pray and give praise and thanksgiving to the Lord -> exiting.

In the wake of the devastating news this week of 215 Indigenous children, buried in unmarked graves at a Residential School on the Tk'emlúps te Secwépemc First Nation, Archbishop Albert takes a moment to reflect. To reflect on the active part the Catholic Church played in the tragedy of colonization here in Canada. To reflect also on what these findings mean for us here in Manitoba.

And also to reflect on our current day reality:

racism is certainly not a thing of the past. How are we to move forward, as a society, in the paths of reconciliation? How are we to respond to this shocking discovery, in a way that is more than a simple flash in the pan? Throughout this month of June, National Indigenous History Month, Archbishop Albert will focus his weekly messages on different issues surrounding reconciliation, and on how we, as a Church and broader society, are to move forward. We all have a part to play, and we all must be active players in the process of healing and reconciliation.


our ongoing commitment to reconciliation. For this, we pray to the Lord."
