Marriage Tip - March 10, 2019

Have you ever tried a "tech fast"? For one day resolve not to use any technology – no TV, computer, cell phone, iPod, etc. Use the time you save to pray and to be present to your family.

"I have now brought you the first fruits of the products of the soil which you,

O Lord, have given to me." (Deuteronomy 26:10)

This line from the Old Testament offers two challenges. First, do you give to God from your "first fruits", the best that you have to offer, or do you give from what is leftover? Second, do you recognize that everything you have has been given to you by God? Ask God for a grateful and generous heart, every day, in all circumstances.

Development and Peace: Share Lent 2019 – Share the Journey

Imagine that your life is in danger and you have to flee your home. You don't have time to prepare or take anything with you. You must flee now. What would you do? Where would you go? How would you feel? More than 68.5 million people worldwide have faced this situation. In fact, every minute, 31 people are forced to flee their homes to escape war, persecution, large-scale development projects, extreme poverty, or the consequences of climate change.

Lent is a sacred period, a time for preparation, transformation, and conversion, offering us the opportunity to deepen and enrich our faith. It is also a privileged moment of encounter with oneself, our loved ones, newcomers of our community, and with God.

1st symbol: A pair of old shoes



This pair of shoes symbolizes the path travelled by forced migrants. In 2017, 68.5 million of our sisters and brothers were forced to flee their homes because they feared for their lives and their safety. They set out on a long and difficult journey, sometimes risking their lives, in the hope of living in dignity and peace.

I am reminded of a child who runs too fast, bumps into a piece of furniture and hurts himself. He turns back, scowls and angrily kicks the furniture. What's the message? Instead of acknowledging that he bumped into it, the child blames the furniture for his pain. He gets his revenge by kicking it.

Christ faced many temptations during his time on earth. The Gospel today presents a dialogue between Christ and the devil. The devil not only destroys harmony and unity; he pits us against our better nature. He used three scenarios to tempt Christ: bread, power and magic. Each of us has a list of age-dependent temptations: at age 15, drugs; at age 20, success; at age 30, money; at age 40, power. We can also be tempted to act immorally and by a desire for vengeance. The devil is powerful and can destroy our inner selves, our

How do we resist? We remain alert and prepared to confront our temptations. We refuse to be separated from our good nature. We restore our relationship with ourselves, others and God. Jesus responded to each temptation by referring to God's Word that dwells in our hearts and minds. God's Word connects us to our Savior and to others.

We cannot allow the devil to silence us, make us fearful and successfully tempt us. When God's Word prevails, the devil becomes insignificant and powerless.
