Parish life:

*According to the new released public health restrictions, all religious gatherings are to remain closed until June 26th. Therefore, we will continue to have one livestreamed mass every weekend alternating between St. Denis & St. Claude, both livestreamed on the St. Claude Facebook page. Father will be celebrating all weekday masses in private for the intentions noted on the bulletins. Everyone is encouraged to do their part in social distancing, sanitizing, and washing hands to help stop this virus from spreading. And get vaccinated as soon as you are eligible. We can do these sacrifices for the good of all.

Let us recite the chaplet of Holy Rosary daily. Through the intercession of Our Lady Mary, let us pray for an end to the pandemic, for our parish, for our families, and for the conversion of all Christians. *NEW: Communion outside after the livestreamed Mass.

Distribution of communion outside is POSSIBLE at this time in compliance with all safety measures. FIVE people from different households can form a line to receive communion. Parishioners can also receive communion via a "drive-thru" method. *Please stay in your* car -> receive Holy Communion -> take a short moment to consume the Body of Christ and silently pray and give praise and thanksgiving to the Lord -> exit. The following is the information regarding the receiving of Holy Communion in our parishes:

- + In St. Denis, Haywood: 10:00 10:30 AM, in front of the church.
- + St. Claude: 12:00 12:30 PM: at the west entrance (main entrance of the church)
- * This Sunday, Fr. Christian Mutomto, a newly-ordained priest of our archdiocese (ordained on June 5, 2021 at the Cathedral of St. Boniface), will be celebrating the Holy Mass in St. Denis-Haywood to pray for our parishes together with Fr. Peter. We welcome Fr. Christian to our parishes and keep him in our prayers as he begins his priestly ministry as pastor of Sts. Martyrs Canadiens parish this summer.

* Bishop LeGatt Video Message – Continuing on the Journey of Reconciliation. Archbishop Albert continues his reflection on reconciliation with Indigenous peoples, particularly in the wake of the discovery, last week, at a Residential School on Tk'emlúps te Secwépemc First Nation. He shares about some of the rich dialogue he has had in the past weeks with many people, and especially with many Indigenous people. The road of reconciliation is a long, complex, and

redemptive one. We all have a part to play, and we all bear the responsibility of being agents to continue this path of healing, through hearing and listening, acknowledgement, apology, and action. We must also continue careful personal introspection, to identify and remediate those seeds of colonization, racism, and hatred that may also be in our hearts, as we humbly continue our Christian and human journey.
