*** Reflections for the separated/divorced**

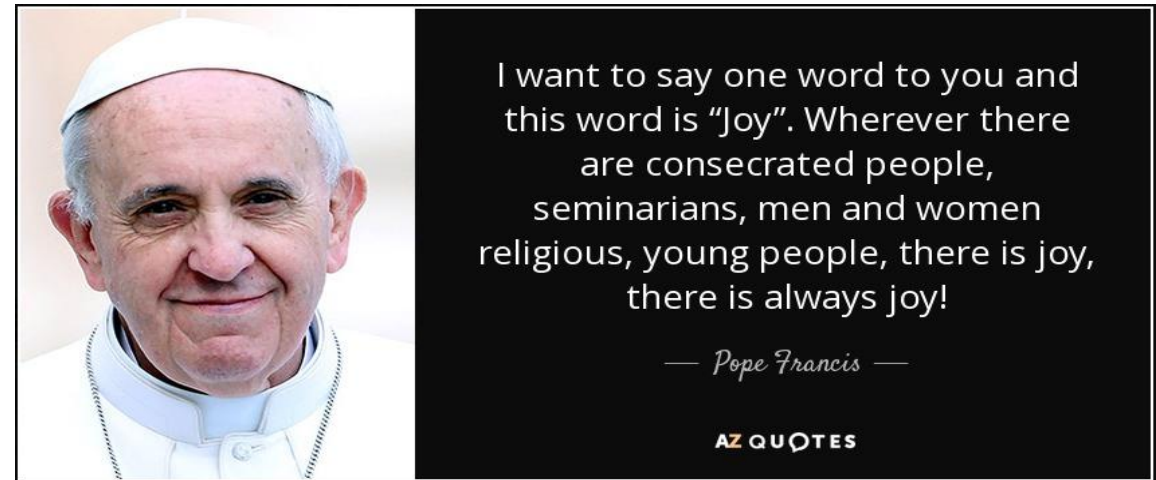
