Seeing Christ

Two Greek visitors had come to Jerusalem to celebrate the Passover. They had heard rumors about Jesus and wanted to see him. As the visitors only spoke Greek, they went to Philip for assistance and made their request.

There was no exchange between the visitors and Jesus, no questions, no responses. Jesus seemed to be lost in thought and began a disconcerting conversation that his time would soon be coming to an end. Christ spoke about

renunciation, death, fear, and the glory that the Father would manifest. His hour of judgment was near. Christ was raised up (at his crucifixion and resurrection). God's Son brought salvation to us.

At first glance, the passage appears to be turbulent and perplexing. The men wished to meet Jesus who greeted them with comments that appeared to be confusing. But when we re-examine the passage, we quickly see another perspective. According to St. John, *seeing* is *believing*. Jesus was not there to shake hands like a movie star. He wanted people to believe in him. Yet, who was he and what was this pathway? What *must we believe* in order to *see Jesus*? What was His message?

Seeing Christ means, that we, like the grain of wheat, must be *buried* in the earth to be reborn.

Seeing Christ means that we agree to lose our lives.

Seeing Christ means that we do not retreat, that we do not give into fear, but we state: Father, glorify your name...

Seeing Christ means we accept the cross and are elevated above the earth. Seeing Christ means we will rise with the Lord.

Seeing Christ means we focus on salvation that is everyone's destiny.
