This week, September 20-25, will take place (virtually) the annual plenary assembly of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB). Each year, all the Catholic bishops of Canada gather, in collegiality, to pray together and to discuss the issues at hand for the Church in Canada, discerning together the ways in which the Holy Spirit is Calling

our Church to continue its journey within our society. This year, an issue of particular importance and significance will of course be that of reconciliation with Indigenous peoples. During this plenary assembly, discussions will cover topics such as the December meeting of Indigenous peoples who live in Canada with Pope Francis in Rome, a future papal visit to Canada, and the concrete action needed from within our Church to humbly and authentically continue in the paths of truth and reconciliation. Please pray, in a very special way September 20-25, for all of these, our Church leaders, as they consider the promptings of the Lord and the issues at hand, especially within our continued context of pandemic, as our bishops continue to lead and shepherd our Church. Please pray that their hearts would be open to the promptings of the Holy Spirit, being faithful instruments of the Will of God, and that the Lord would continue to move in powerful ways through our local and national Church.
