Pastoral Appointments for 20187

By decision of Archbishop Albert LeGatt, D.D., after consultation with the College of Consultors, the following are the assignments of priests and Parish Life Directors in the Archdiocese of Saint Boniface for the current year. Unless otherwise agreed upon with those concerned, the appointments will be effective August 1, 2018. (quote from the letter of Archbishop LeGatt)

Saint-Claude - Haywood (Saint-Denis)

Father John Tê Nguyen is appointed once again as Priest-Moderator for a one-year mandate.

Mrs. Denise Danais is appointed as Parish Life Director, responsible for the coordination of all aspects of pastoral life and activities in Saint-Claude and Saint-Denis (Haywood) Parishes, for a third one-year mandate. In Saint-Claude, the Parish Finance Committee will take on responsibility for directing the financial and temporal administration for a one-year mandate. Mr. Raymond Massinon will continue as Parish Life Director in Saint-Denis Parish (Haywood) for financial and temporal administration for a further one-year mandate.

His name will be John

In the Jewish tradition, the eldest son would bear his father's name. As the son is the image of the father, he would keep his memory alive. Having a son meant survival and if the son bore the father's name, his place in history would be recorded and remembered. This tradition continues today. In the English-speaking world, the practice is

common, and we distinguish the son from the father by adding "Junior".

Elizabeth and Zachariah were an elderly couple and the son born to them was a blessing from God, one that they had always hoped for. The Lord demonstrated the magnificence of His mercy. On the eighth day, it was the tradition to name the child. People said that his name should be Zachariah, like his father. However, Elizabeth said: No, he is to be called John. They asked Zachariah, who could not speak. He wrote on a tablet: His name is John. ... Immediately his mouth was opened and his tongue freed and he began to speak, praising God.

What can we learn from the passage? The name, Zachariah means: the Lord has remembered. John means: the Lord has been gracious and has shown favor. Jesus means: the Lord saves. There is continuity. The elderly Zachariah received God's benevolence. A son was born to him. John witnessed God's benevolence. He assumed the role of precursor and announced the coming of *One* who was greater. Jesus brought salvation and accomplished God's work among us.

June 24th is our summer solstice and light is at its peak. St. John's birth celebrates the splendor of summer and the power of divine love. This exuberant light announces another birth that is to come, at Christmas, when Christ will bring everlasting light. Happy Saint John the Baptist!
