Let us pray for this child, for his parents and godmother, for all the members of his family, and for all the members of our parish community, who have the responsibility of journeying in faith with Julien and his family.

Michael's Cathedral Basilica. They will be presided over by Auxiliary Bishop Alain Faubert from the Diocese of Montreal and Cardinal Thomas Collins, archbishop of Toronto, respectively.
