Trusting in God's Promise



On this final Sunday of Advent, we are on the doorstep of Christmas. The pilgrimage of hope is nearly complete, and today's Gospel (Luke 1:39-45) gives us the powerful example of Mary's trust in God's providence. Amid uncertainty, Mary, with child, sets out to be with her cousin Elizabeth trusting in God's accompaniment.

It is the response of John within Elizabeth's womb that leads to her proclamation, "Most blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb.: one of deep faith and trust. Though she didn't understand fully what was happening, she trusted and delighted in

God's presence. The Pilgrims of Hope, like Mary and Elizabeth, are called to trust, to joyfully surrender, and to believe that God's promises will come to fruition, even when the way is unclear.

In this final week of Advent, we are reminded to trust in God's plan for our lives

and to prepare our hearts to receive Jesus with the same joy, trust and openness that Mary and Elizabeth demonstrated. Just as Mary was a faithful pilgrim, so too are we called to walk in faith, trusting that God's presence will guide us through all the unknowns of life.

As we approach Christmas, let us ask ourselves: How can I trust more deeply in God's plan for my life? How can I open my heart to His coming in a new and profound way? Let us prepare for the arrival of Christ with hearts full of faith and trust in His promises.
