October- Month of the Holy Rosary

Dear brothers and sisters,

The month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. During this time, Catholics try to keep the Mother of God more present in their hearts, with a love shown in affectionate devotion to our Lady. The Rosary is taken from the Latin word “rosarium” which means “crown of roses” or “garland of roses.” When we pray the holy rosary, we offer our Mother, Blessed Virgin Mary spiritual bouquets of roses that she really loves. Mediating on the joyful, luminous, sorrowful, and glorious mysteries allows us to ponder very specific and important events in the lives of Jesus and Mary. And each mystery, each moment in their lives, holds incredible insights for our own lives today. Especially, when praying the Rosary, believe that our Lady will be by our side at the very last moment when we finish our earthly pilgrimage, **“Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen”**.

Therefore, brothers and sisters, during this month of October and every day, remember to carry a rosary in your pocket and pray anytime you can, even fall asleep praying the rosary. If you can't pray the whole rosary at once, break it into parts.

We pray the Rosary for peace in the world, for the souls in purgatory and for the conversion all sinners! Holy rosary is a spiritual weapon against sin and temptation.

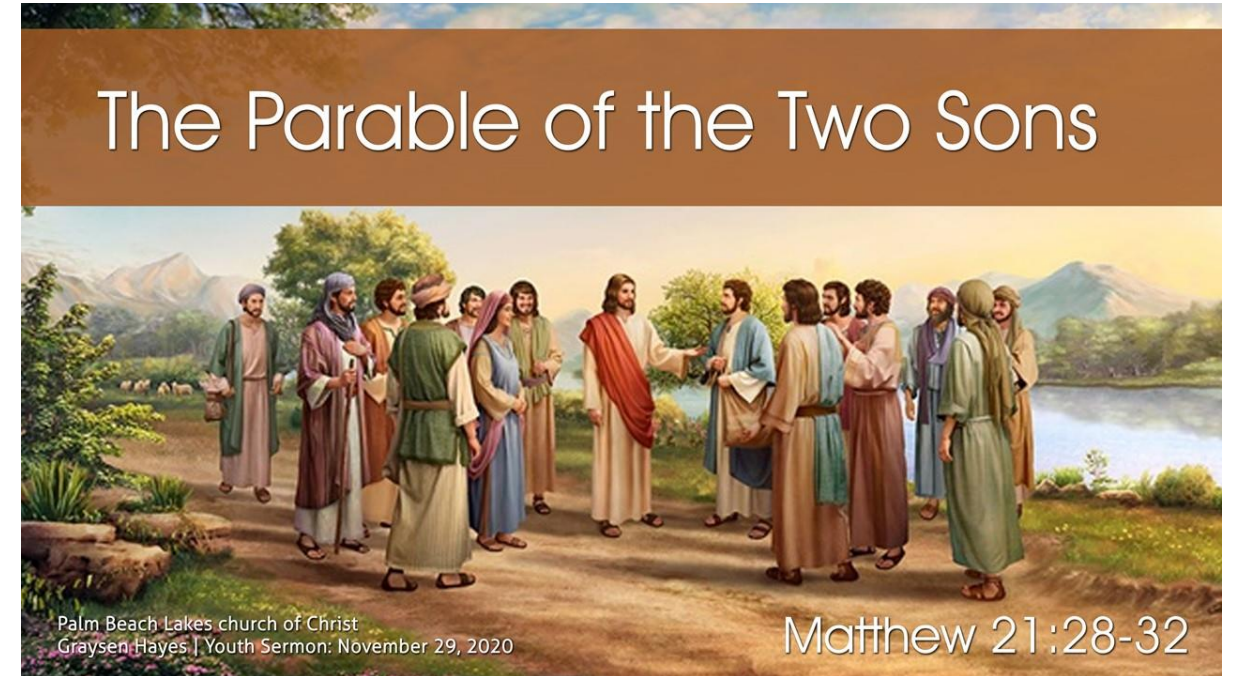
* Morocco needs your support! Donate to Caritas Morocco today!

Nearly 3,000 people have been killed by the powerful earthquake (magnitude 6.8) that struck Morocco overnight on Friday, September 8. More than 5,500 people have been injured. There has been widespread

Some 380,000 people have been directly affected and UNICEF estimates that about 100,000 children will need protection.
