

On the occasion of the 34th World Day of the Sick, we, the Catholic Bishops of Manitoba, wish to extend our heartfelt gratitude and spiritual support to all who dedicate their lives to caring for the sick, the elderly and the vulnerable.

In collaboration with the Catholic Health Association of Manitoba, we are pleased to announce the Inaugural Mass for All Healthcare Workers of Manitoba. This celebration is an expression of our deep appreciation for compassion, sacrifice, and commitment shown daily by those who serve in the

healing professions.

We cordially invite physicians, nurses, caregivers, hospital staff, chaplains, administrators and volunteers to join us. While this mass is celebrated in a Catholic celebration, healthcare workers of all faiths and backgrounds are most welcome.
