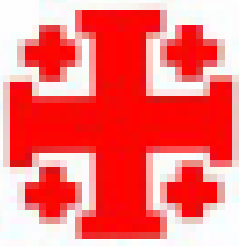

JUBILEE 2025:

SAINT-CLAUDE CHURCH & GROTTO SITES FOR DIVINE GRACE

The Saint-Claude church and the Lourde's grotto in Saint-Claude have been designated unique and special sites, among 18 others in Manitoba, for pilgrimage devotion during this 2025 Jubilee year. Thus, parishioners and pilgrims, welcomed from afar, will find available, at the Saint-Claude church entrances, pertinent information booklets and leaflets guiding them to best appreciate and live fully the value of this Jubilee 2025 at visits at those sites. The documents available at the church are the following:

- ***A Pilgrim's Guide to Jubilee Churches and Shrines:*** booklet published by the Archdiocese of Saint-Boniface, the Archdiocese of Winnipeg, and the Ukrainian Catholic Archeparchy of Winnipeg. Free of charge.
- ***The Saint-Claude Church:*** booklet introducing the uniqueness of this parish church, published in 2015 by the Tourism and Marketing Committee. Cost: \$7.

Passion (Palm) Sunday - April 13, 2025

"Father, forgive them, they know not what they do."



Today, we read the narrative of the Passion from the Gospel of Luke. According to this evangelist, Jesus entering Jerusalem to a joyous palm parade and the passion narrative are mutually related even though the first part may sound exultant while the second part sounds rather humiliating.

Jesus enters Jerusalem as a messianic king, humble, peaceful, with a servant's attitude, not as temporal king using and abusing his power. The cross is the throne from which He reigns (He is not missing the royal crown!), by loving and forgiving. Luke's Gospel can, indeed, be summarized by saying it reveals Jesus' love through his all-encompassing mercy and forgiveness.

Jesus' mercy and forgiveness are certainly shown throughout Jesus' life, but more evidently upon His crucifixion. How meaningful are the three words we can today hear at the Cross, from Jesus' lips!

—He loves and forgives even his executioners: "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do." (Lk 23:34).

—To the thief at his right, who asked Jesus to remember him forever in his Kingdom, Jesus grants forgiveness and salvation: "Today you will be with me in Paradise." (Lk 23:43).

—Above all, Jesus manifests His forgiveness and love in the supreme moment of his submission when He cries out: "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit" (Lk 23:46).

This is the Master's last lesson at the Cross: mercy and forgiveness, the fruits of love. But forgiving is so difficult for us! Nevertheless, by experiencing in our own lives the saving and forgiving love of Jesus, it will not be so difficult for us to look at others with tenderness: Tenderness that forgives with love and absolves without meanness.

Saint Francis of Assisi expresses it in his Canticle of the Creatures: "Praised be You, my Lord, through those who give pardon for Your love."
