RCIA stands for Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. It's a process that helps non-Catholics and baptized Catholics who haven't received their First Communion or Confirmation become fully initiated into the Catholic Church.

3rd Sunday of Advent (C) - December 15th, 2024

Rejoicing in Hope



As we continue our Advent pilgrimage of hope, we arrive today at the Third Sunday of Advent, a day traditionally known as "Gaudete Sunday." Gaudete, meaning "Rejoice," invites us to pause and reflect on the joy that is to come with the arrival of Christ. It is a reminder that, even in our waiting, we have reason to rejoice, for the hope we long for is already on the horizon.

In today's Gospel (Luke 3:10-18), we hear about the witness of John the Baptist once again. John points to the light, to the One who is coming after him, and he says, "I am baptizing you with water,

but one mightier than I is coming. "John's role was to prepare the way, to remind the people of God's promise, and to stir within them a longing for salvation.

For us, today, the Pilgrims of Hope are called to rejoice, for we are pilgrims journeying toward Christ, who is the light of the world. Our hope is not in the distance; it is here, in our hearts, even as we await its fullness at His coming. The joy of Advent is rooted in the conviction that God is near, that He is with us, and that He will fulfill His promises.

So, let us rejoice today in the hope that Advent brings! Even as we continue our journey of prayer, fasting, and penance, let us lift our hearts in joy, knowing that Christ is near. And let us ask ourselves: How can I be a witness to the light of Christ in my life? How can I share the joy and hope I have with others during this season?
